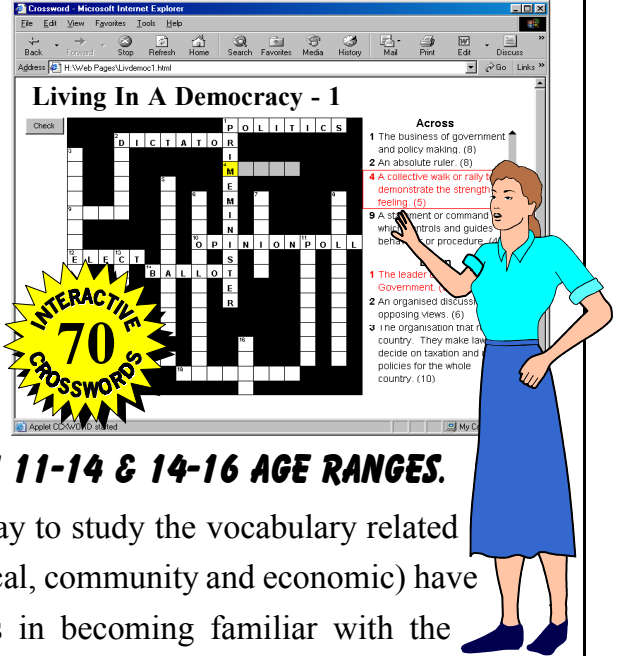

Literacy in Citizenship is structured into 23 core topics. The 11-14 pack amounts to 160+ master pages and the 11-16 pack is over 260 pages in total. Solutions to the crosswords and wordsearches are also provided. Differentiate by allowing pupils to choose between a crossword or wordsearch - the associated word exercise ensures a similar outcome. The crossword support sheets (see facing page) provide an intermediate task level between the crosswords and wordsearches.

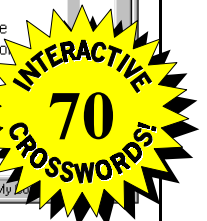

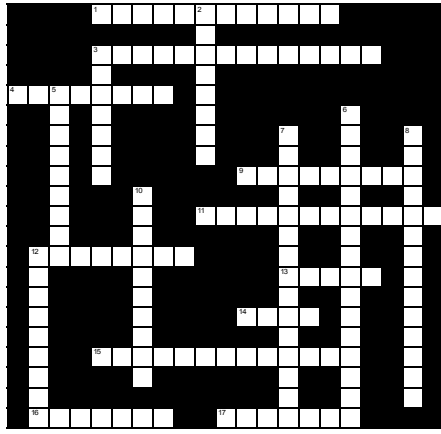
