 - A colour produced by a pattern of differently coloured dots that simulate the desired colour. Also known as dithered colour. (3-5)
 - An area of a drawing you select by using the Scissors or Pick tool in a painting program. (3-3)

 - Short for Image Colour Matching. (3)

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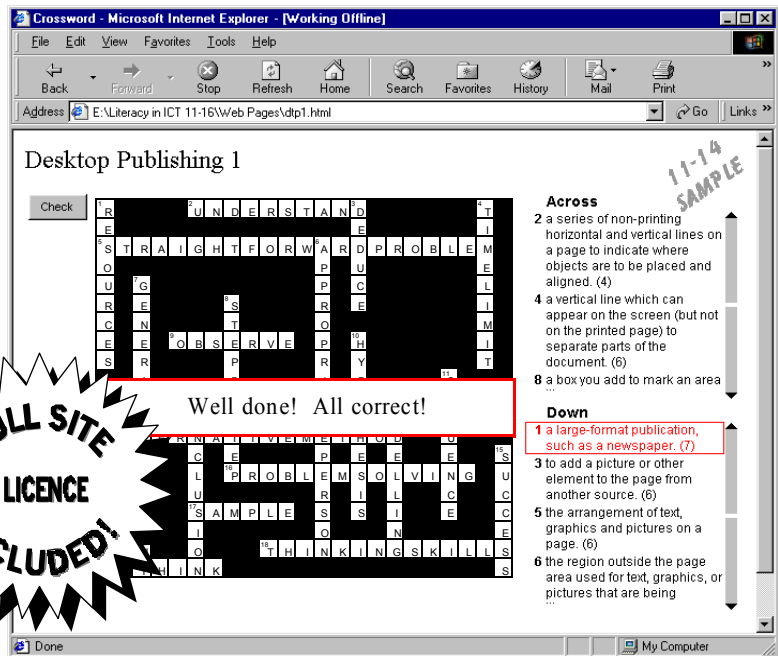
