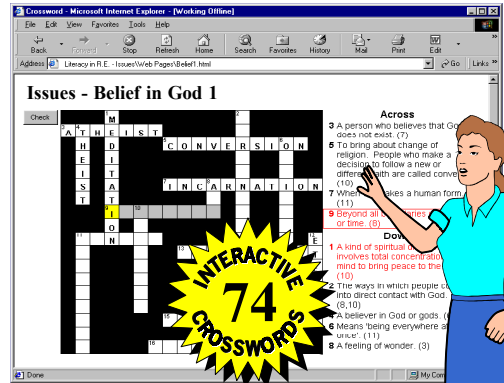
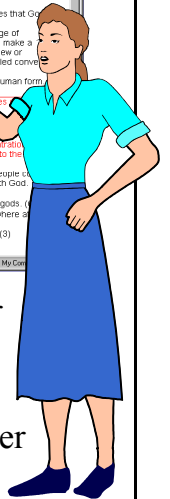

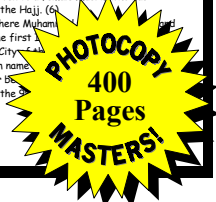

- A roll of parchment on which the Torah is written. (6)
- This means 'A Son of the Commandment' and refers to the stage where a boy becomes a man in the Jewish faith. (3,7)
- The first five books of the Jewish Bible, containing the most important teaching in their holy books. It is also called the Pentateuch. (5)
- The holy books. The main Jewish holy book is called the Torah. (10)
- This refers to the Jews living outside their homeland. This has happened to them many times in their history. (5)
- A Jewish teacher, who often leads worship in a synagogue. Their main job is to teach Jews about the law. (5)
- A Jewish place of worship. It comes from a word meaning 'assembly'. (9)
- Making up for something you have done wrong. (9)
- A King of Egypt. (7)
- A devotional poem read during synagogue services. (5)

- Someone who tells people what God wants of them. Moses, Hosa and Isaiah are examples. They spoke out to try to persuade the Hebrews to remain faithful to their one God. (7)
- The Jewish language in which the Torah is read. In an Orthodox synagogue the service is in this language. (6)
- A seven-branched candlestick often used as a symbol for Judaism. There is usually one in a synagogue as there was one in the original Temple in Jerusalem. (7)
- An offering made to God. (9)
- To go without food and drink, often for religious reasons. Jews fast at Yom Kippur for 25 hours. (4)
- A group of people meeting at worship. (12)
- An unjustified dislike of people, often based on race or religion. Jews have often been victims of this. (9)
- The escape from Egypt led by Moses. This is remembered at Pesach (Passover). (6)
- The name for the Jewish religion. (7)

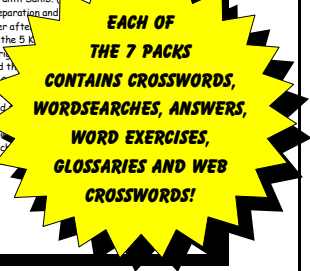

- A word that means 'teacher'. Literally, "One who leads from darkness into light". There are ten of them in Sikhism. (4)
- The main language spoken in the Punjab, where Sikhism began. It is also spoken by Sikhs all over the world. (7)
- The festival of light, shared with Hindus. (6)
- This means 'free kitchen'. It is the name used for the meal prepared at the Gurdwara. Everyone eats this after a service. (6)
- An area in the North West of India where Sikhism originated. It means the 'land of five rivers'. (6)
- A handkerchief, which Sikh boys wear over their long hair before they are old enough to wear a turban. (5)
- A Sikh service in a Gurdwara. (5)
- A name, given to all Sikh Females, which means 'princess'. This shows how women should behave and be treated. (4)
- A name adopted by male Sikhs. It means 'lion'. It describes how male Sikhs should behave and be treated. A lion is strong and fearless but also caring and gentle. (5)
- The first Guru and the founder of Sikhism. (1469-1539) (4,5)

- A head covering worn by male Sikhs. It is a special time for a boy when he becomes old enough to wear one. It is an important symbol of Sikhism. (6)

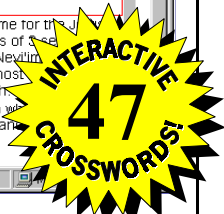

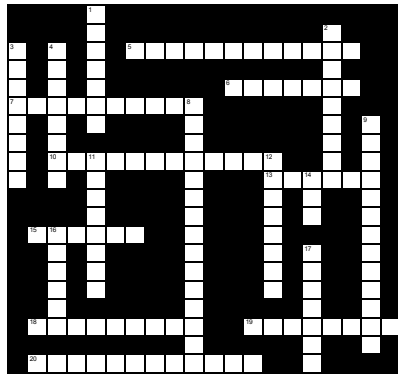
